Mr. Rodgers is investigating.

Councilman Carmestro met with all three of his groups. He traveled with Art Fritz, Code Enforcement Officer for two hours to see the types of violations that currently exist within the town. He attended the Fire Commissioners meeting. They are purchasing a 12-15 person van on state bid which they will be receiving next month for a total cost of \$21,000 to them. Hydrant flags are being purchased to replace broken/damaged existing flags and to add flags for new hydrants. The Town is being asked to purchase approximately 40 flags and can be done in conjunction with those being ordered by the Fire Department to provide a pricing advantage.
