# **CALL TO ORDER**

Supervisor McCann called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. and lead those present in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag, followed by a moment of silence. Supervisor McCann noted emergency exit procedures.

# **PUBLIC FORUM**

Supervisor McCann asked if there was anyone who wished to address the Town Board.

Rick Lemcke asked why the proposed budget is raising more than the 2% new tax cap and if the cap was on the rate. Supervisor McCann responded that the 2.1% budget increase as presented is tentative. The cap is 2% of the levy. The budget is not in a final form because there are still many unanswered questions regarding the cap and how it should be calculated. As recent as yesterday the Finance Director attended a session offered by the Comptroller's Office to obtain more information on this. A lot of unanswered questions remain. Mr. Lemcke noted that money was being taken from fund balances and asked if these funds were coming from the Library. Supervisor McCann responded that money is coming from different sources and the funds are unappropriated balances. He indicated that what is in the budget is what is planned at this time. He expects that there will be more in depth discussion at the next two meetings.

#### MINUTES – SEPTEMBER 20, 2011

**RESOLUTION NO. 182-2011** Motion by Councilman Carmestro, seconded by Councilman Roose, to accept the minutes of September 20, 2011 as submitted.

### **TOWN CLERK REPORT**

The Town Clerk and VFW reports for September have been submitted. A request has been received from Galaxy Enterprises to exclusively lease the VFW Hall kitchen for their food management operation. Some of their catered functions could use the VFW Hall and others might require only the use of the kitchen. It was decided that this would be addressed later in the meeting.

The school tax first installment surrender has been completed and sent to the Monroe County Treasury. Correspondence has been received from Dorothy Swingle on behalf of the Hilton Lioness Club requesting that the Town Board continue to have vendors/fundraising opportunities during Parma Fest Days. A copy of correspondence was also received from Assemblyman Steve Hawley's Office requesting the Governor to

call the Legislature back into session to address mandate relief which is affecting municipalities even more because of the current property tax cap.

### HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT REPORT

Supt. Speer reported that work on the Hamlin Parma TL Road has not been completed. He expects the contractor back next Wednesday or Thursday. One large area of contaminated soil from the old bus garage on Grove Street has been dug out and backfilled. A problem with landfill permits has delayed work on the other area at that site. Work continues on the Hill Road Bridge Replacement project.

Supt. Speer provided the Town Board with a list of items recently sold at the Tietsworth auction. The value less commission was \$6,502.50.

# **BUILDING DEPARTMENT REPORT**

Mr. Barton noted that earlier this year he informed the Town Board that Parma had been selected as one of ten communities in the area that would be eligible for stormwater green project grant funding. Stormwater runoff at the highway garage and discharge into the creek at Town Hall Park were identified as potential high priority projects dealing with stormwater that would be eligible. The grant application is now available and he would like to apply. These grants would require a 10% match from the Town which can be inkind services and New York State will cover the remaining 90%. The Town Board was in agreement to proceed with the application.

# RECREATION DEPARTMENT REPORT

Mr. Fowler reported the 32<sup>nd</sup> Apple Derby 5 Mile Run was held last Saturday with 67 participants. Upcoming events include a brief ceremony on Saturday October 15<sup>th</sup> to celebrate the completion of the Town Hall Park Field Lighting Project and on the same day the annual Halloween event at the Village Community Center.

Mr. Fowler reported that all grant applications will be applied for and processed through the Consolidated Funding Application's (CFA) on-line application for grant funding. He described the ranking process, the purpose of the changes and noted that the next set of applications must be submitted by October 31<sup>st</sup>. He requested that the Town officially register with New York State.

Councilman Smith reported that additional quotes have been received regarding the roof repairs in the court area. It was not clear from what was submitted, if the contractor with the low quote meets all the specifications. He will follow up and have a recommendation for the next meeting.

### **BUSINESS ITEMS**

### ESTABLISHMENT OF NORTH AVENUE SANITARY SEWER DISTRICT #3

Supervisor McCann noted that the public hearing for the creation of this sewer district was held on September 20, 2011 and the location was for 590 North Avenue. Since that

meeting the response has been received from Monroe County Planning and Development and there were no comments. Monroe County Department of Transportation requested that if a map is required to be filed in the County Clerk's Office that monumentation be checked by the County Survey Office. The New York State Department of Transportation noted that a highway work permit is required in the Route 259 right of way for utility and grading work.

The Environmental Assessment Form has been received from the applicant and Part 1was reviewed. The Town Board proceeded to review and answer the questions in Part 2.

### **MISCELLANEOUS**

Galaxy Enterprises – There was discussion on whether the Town Board wished to approve the Galaxy Enterprises request for use of the VFW Hall for their catering business. Discussion included potential conflicts with entities already using the Hall, the building is not set up for this, rentals interrupted by use of kitchen for their functions, lack of sewers and concerns due to prior problems. The Town Board was in agreement that they were not interested at this time and that a letter would be sent.

Annual Training – each year members of the Planning and Zoning Boards are required to take four hours of training. A member of the Zoning Board has requested the Town Board accept participation in a full day session which included zoning as well as building related information. Half the class pertained to zoning. Mr. Barton noted that he reviewed the syllabus for the class and felt that it was appropriate for the four hours of credit, however it is at the discretion of the Town Board to approve.

National Incident Management System (NIMS) – Correspondence was received by Mr. Barton on September 28<sup>th</sup> that a NIMS report was due on the thirtieth. It has come to the Monroe County Office of Emergency Management's attention that no one received notification of the deadline and the County will make New York State aware that the report will be late. New for this year's reporting is adoption of twenty forms pertaining to communication and status reports that will be used during an emergency and provide a uniform reporting method. There are three positions that will need to be filled and there will be required training for each. Appointment of a Public Information Officer who will have authority to speak as the primary point person for communications is one position. A Resource Officer and a coordinating position will also need to be appointed. It was noted that most of the resources the Town would have to offer would be coming from the Highway Department and that a Highway employee would be the likely choice for this. Councilman Smith said he would consider the Public Information Officer position. Jack Barton will send job descriptions to each of the Town Board members and the training requirements.

# **INFORMATIONAL ITEMS**

There were none. Supervisor McCann informed those at the meeting that the Town Board would adjourn into executive session after the Liaison Reports and when they come out there would be no further business taken up by the Town Board.

### LIAISON REPORTS

\*\*Councilman Smith reported it had come to his attention that the freshman football team would like to hold an evening game at the Town Hall Park field. Due to wet conditions over the weekend, the desire not to tear up the field and the need to schedule makeup

games for the Raiders it was determined that the school game would not be held here. Along this same line, there was also discussion on removing the Recreation Department from being in middle for the scheduling of make up games for Babe Ruth. Consideration should be given to having the Parks Department coordinate the scheduling of make-up games and the impact that this might have on the scheduling of pavilion rentals. This will be discussed more in the future.

- \*\*Councilman Comardo reported the Recreation Commission reviewed a report on Revenue and Expense for all programs and a summary of net costs for the department over the last ten to twelve years and discussion on plans for vehicle replacement He noted that the Planning Board will be meeting later this week and that he has met with Jim Zollweg regarding what is available to us and future options for use of GIS.
- \*\*Councilman Carmestro reported that the Hilton Parma Fire District meets tomorrow and North Greece meets later this month. The opening of the new TOPS Highlights of the Village meeting included the opening of TOPS, Apple Fest and acquisition of a new steam table for the Senior Program.
- \*\*Councilman Roose reported that the Zoning Board Special Police meetings are coming up and that training requirements for the Special Police are changing from 20 hours to 99 hours. In the past this training has been free and they will be checking with Greece.

Supervisor McCann asked if there were any other matters to be brought before the Board. There were none.
